The Isarel Election Study of 1973 was conducted in five phases: the first two before the Yom Kipur War of October 1973, and the following three after the war.

The May 1973 survey (pp. 1-40) was based on a representative sample of the urban adult Jewish population and included 1939 respondents.

The September 1973 survey(pp. 41-80) is a panel of the May sample with 548 of the May interviwees reinterviewed in September.

Three interviews were held after the war on three separate representative samples of the adult urban Jewish population. One in November (pp. 81-98) with 642 respondents, the second in December (pp. 99-119) with 530 respondents (the elections were held on December 31, 1973, after the December survey).

The third post-war survey was conducted in January 1974 (pp. 120-138) and had 1066 respondents.

The field research was conducted by the Israeli Institute for Applied Social Research; the research project was conducted by Asher Arian and Ephraim Turgovnik.

All findings here appear in percentages. To the left of the question appears the phase and punch card position. The numbers in parentheses indicate the punch in the respective card, the numbers to the right of the answer indicate the percentage distribution of each question.

In the May and September reporting, the entire sample is included in each question and the "no answer" percentage is reported. For the November, December and January samples, the percentage distribution reported is based on respondents who answered the question. The total number of answers is reported as "Total" for each question. The difference between the sample size and the "Total" is the number of "no answer" responses.
